"Please remember us in your will"

The essential message of today's Gospel is so clear that it actually needs no interpretation: "Beware and beware of all covetousness, for a man's life does not consist in his possessions." And "be rich in the sight of God!. But since acquiring possessions is a fundamentally human aspiration, it is worth delving into the details of the parable of the rich fool told by Jesus. Wealth gives people a certain security, allows them to control their own lives, not to depend completely on others or the state, to organize their own sphere of life, to pursue things that please them, to realize great missions or great goals. To this extent, possessions are necessary for a righteous existence. Jesus states that possessions and wealth lead people to feel distant from God and their neighbors, to think they are insured against poverty, old age, and death, and to satisfy the pleasures of this world. And yet, for many people, material success is a symbol of God's blessing. They believe they have fulfilled their role in life well when they acquire wealth and respect. And that God cannot expect more from them. Now, for them too, the chief commandment is the ultimate criterion that will allow them to judge their lives. This is why wealth must be a means of action for everyone: a means of committing oneself to others. By helping those who are discouraged and sharing generously, one will be truly rich: rich in the eves of God.

MARY, MOST POOR

From Mary's first appearance in the Gospels, she is clearly shown to be a person who embraced both material and spiritual poverty. She is one of the Lord's "faithful poor," his "anawim" as the ancient Israelites would have said. Material poverty was the rich soil in which her spiritual poverty grew and matured. In Mary's Journey, Fr. Louis Cameli writes: Although poverty obviously implies a lack of material wealth, we would be mistaken to limit it exclusively to material things. There is another concept of poverty that is religious, and not merely social and economic. In the Old Testament the "poor of Israel," the anawim, refers to those who are in need of God and open to his will. Their poverty is linked mainly with the possibilities of faith, not with destitution. Their lives reflect the covenant faith of Israel. They sense their dependence on God. They deeply feel a need for God's saving power in their own relatively powerless lives. The anawim remember God and know their dependence. Israel recalled the great acts of God when the people were especially mindful of God and their dependence on him. God led a poor, enslaved people out of Egypt. God brought back a poor, exiled people to their land. God called a poor young girl of Nazareth to be the mother of the Messiah. https://www.thedivinemercy.org/articles/part-13-marymost-poor
